

All 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade science classes, including parents, are invited to attend our second evening under the stars Saturday, May 11 from 8:30 to 9:30 PM in the parking lot near SW corner of campus.

We plan to have 3 telescopes set up to view the **first quarter moon, the double star in Big Dipper, and possibly other objects**; weather permitting. You are welcome to bring binoculars.

Some things to consider:

- When pulling into parking lot, drive with caution and try to avoid shining headlights toward telescope area.
- A flash light with red cellophane covering, or a dim red light is preferred.
- When viewing, please try to avoid bumping telescope. Gently approach eyepiece, and look briefly at each setup; consider the people behind you waiting their turn.
- The 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade science teachers, as well as the SPA STEM Club members, will be operating or assisting with telescopes, and acting as "docents".
